- Coordinate externally with other vital agencies, i.e., Three Affiliated Tribes (TAT), Natural Resource Committee, Farm Service Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Fort Berthold Extension Service, Natural Resource Conservation Service, and Regional/State/National USDA Units
- Prepare and submit reports required by FBCC and USDA
- Supervise professional, support and student personnel and provide timely evaluations of Beginning Farmer and Rancher Development Program personnel
- Work effectively and cooperatively with students, community, teachers, administrators and support staff
- Market and promote the FBCC Agriculture program including the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation Beginning Farmer and Rancher Development Program.
- Possess and maintain a working knowledge of industry expectations for curriculum and equipment
- Promote integration of academic skills and specific CTE curriculum for relevant career preparation.
- Establish and maintain standards of behavior needed to provide an orderly, productive and safe environment for learning.
- Develop quality work-based learning opportunities for students coordinate student internships.
- Develop and work closely with an effective advisory committee.
